(1) CCD Membership

The Management Committee would like to thank the staff of the Division of Speech and Hearing Sciences, Faculty of Education, for their work in support of the centre throughout the year.



The CCD hosted a stimulating series of seminars presented by a diverse range of local and international experts in the field of communication disorders during 2012-2013. We were especially pleased to once again host the all-day workshop run by the HKCOLAS team, which was a significant contribution to the professional development of the over 40 attendees.

Our seminars are now being given formal Continuing Education Programme points by both the Hong Kong Society of Audiology and the Hong Kong Association of Speech Therapists.



(4) Publications

There continues to be low volume, but steady, sales of our current in-print publications. These are *Communication and Swallowing Impairments after Brain Injury: A Handbook for Survivors and Family Members* (Kong, 2009); *Lessac-Madsen Resonant Voice Therapy: Clinician and Patient Manuals. Chinese editions* (Verdolini Abbott & Chan, 2009); *Hong Kong Graded Character Naming Test for Primary School Children* (Leung, Cheng-Lai & Kwan, 2008); and the *Hong Kong Corpus of Primary School Chinese* (Leung, 2007), as well as our new publication the *Manual of Clinical Voice Assessment and Therapy: A Hong Kong Perspective* by Professor Edwin Yiu (2012). The Centre welcomes publication proposals from academics and professionals working with individuals with communication disorders.

(5) Communications

The CCD website [http://www.hku.hk/ccdhku/] has been used to promote our seminars and publications, and to provide general information about the Centre. This continues to lead to numerous enquiries from overseas researchers interested in learning more about out work.

(6) Financial Report

The CCD currently has a surplus of \$34,870.88, from an income of \$296,567.01 and expenditures of \$261,696.13. The Financial Report is attached. This compares with a surplus of \$69,716.46 in 2011-12.

(7) Future Directions

The CCD is consolidating its track record in the publication of material that links communication disorders research to professional practice. Future possible publications are being actively explored. Workshops and seminars will continue to increase awareness of the CCD and focus on research areas, particularly multidisciplinary and translational research areas, of interest to our members and the community. As before, efforts to raise funding for the CCD, through workshops, publications and grants, will continue to be given priority. In addition, the Centre will continue to strive to raise its profile with professional groups in Hong Kong.
